### Wearable Art Fair Competition and Creative Trade Route Launch Press release: 23rd June 2019.

On Friday 14<sup>th</sup> June over 350 people came to Gloucester Cathedral for an extravaganza evening of wearable art hosted by Art Couture Painswick, (ACP) Create Gloucestershire (CG) and South Gloucestershire & Stroud College. (SGS

The event was the launch of a new Creative Trade Route bringing a range of creative venues and community groups along the A46 between Stroud and Gloucester. The stunning surroundings of Gloucester Cathedral provided a dramatic backdrop for an evening of fun, creativity and inspired by biomimicry and robotics.

Children from Gloucester Schools shared the catwalk with fashion students from Stroud and Sth Glos College and professional body paint artists and makers from across the UK.

ACP part funded three artist residencies in the run up to the launch night, alongside Gloucester Culture Trust, Create Gloucestershire and Comino Foundation to form an exciting partnership, born through the Art of Libraries legacy in Gloucester and Matson library. These artists have worked with local children to inspire creativity and innovation in wearable art. Venture Playground, Moat and Robinswood Primary schools, Tredworth Infants, Widden Primary, Kingsholm Primary, Gloucester Academy, Denmark Road High School have all been involved.

Competition winners were decided by a panel of local judges with expertise in design, fashion, robotics, and engineering.
